



INGREDIENTS:

250 g butter 250 g dark brown sugar
6 eggs
250 g sultanas
250 g raisins
200 g currants
100 g dates
60 g chopped red glace cherries
60 g mixed peel
60 g chopped almonds
375 g plain flour
1 tsp baking powder
1 tsp mixed spice
200 ml sherry or brandy

METHOD:

Mix together all fruits and soak in the sherry or brandy overnight. Sift together flour, baking powder and spice. Cream together butter and sugar. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour and lastly the chopped nuts. Mix thoroughly. Place mixture in prepared square tin (approx. 19-22 cm in size). Bake in a slow over for approximately 3-3½ hours.

Note: fruit should be cut to the size of currants.

HINTS FOR ABOVE COMPETITIONS:

- 1. Cakes should be cooked evenly all over top, bottom and sides should be of even colour. Points to be deducted for uneven cooking.
- 2. Cakes must be well cooked right through no damp or soggy patches.
- 3. Fruit should be evenly distributed throughout cake.
- 4. Fruit should be moist and clean.
- 5. Cake should be of a good even shape.
- 6. Points to be deducted for cake rack marks, burnt edges, pieces of paper or foil which were not removed properly from cake, marks on cake from careless removal of paper.
- 7. All cakes will be cut by the judge.
- 8. Points to be allocated as follows:

Appearance 20 points Cooking 10 points Texture 10 points Flavour 10 points

- 2. A separate entry form **must** be used for each section.
- 3. If you have any questions, please contact the section convenor directly.
- 4. Entries and payment of fees must be received by the Show Secretary before the closing date. Please consult the notes for individual sections for specific closing dates.
- 5. A stamped, self-addressed envelope must be provided, otherwise all tickets and receipts will need to be collected from the Show Office prior to Show Day.
- 6. No phone or late entries accepted. Late entries will be returned to exhibitor.
- 7. Entries can be made:

By posting a completed entry form to the Secretary, PO Box 844, Mt Barker, SA 5251, accompanied by the required fees.

In person at the Show Office, Mount Barker Football Ground, entrance off Alexandrina Road. Please contact the Secretary on 0499 435 314 or check the show website www.mountbarkerdistrictshow.org.au for opening hours.

By emailing a completed, scanned copy of the entry form(s) to the Secretary at show@internode.on.net. Payments should be identified by the exhibitor's surname and phone-number (for example, SMITH 88881234).

BY-LAWS, RULES & REGULATIONS

MEMBERSHIP

1a. Membership is compulsory for all livestock and horse exhibitors, but is optional for all other exhibitors

1b. All members over 18 years of age are entitled to vote at the Annual General, Special General & General Committee meetings

ADMISSION

2a. Any person wishing to leave the grounds with the intention of returning must obtain a pass-out at the gates.

2b. The Show grounds will open at 6 am on Show Day for Exhibitors and Traders. 2c. Handicrafts, Jams, Preserves & Art exhibits must be delivered by various set times on Friday prior to the Show (see Section Regulations for specific times). Flower exhibits can also be received on Friday evening, between 6 pm and 8 pm only.

2d. All other pavilion exhibits must be staged for judging by 9 am Saturday and must not be removed before 4.30 pm.

2e. The show halls will be cleared of all persons at 4 pm Saturday and be opened at 4.30 pm only to exhibitors presenting their exhibitor's pass to the door-keepers for the purpose of collecting their exhibits.

2f. Livestock exhibits will be received at the show grounds up to 8:30 am on Saturday and must not be removed before 4.30 pm.

2g. No truck or trailer used for transporting of livestock may be parked inside the showgrounds without approval.

TRADE SPACE EXHIBITS

3a. Applications for Trade Sites must be in the hands of the secretary by the advertised closing date.

3b. All trade space exhibits must be in position by 9 am Saturday and may not be removed before 4.30 pm Saturday. All cars must be removed by 9 am and may not re-enter the grounds until 4.30 pm.

3c. The Society will take no responsibility whatsoever for any accidents or injuries to any persons caused by trade space exhibits or exhibitors.

SECTION REGULATIONS, ENTRIES & EXHIBITS

4a. The Show has a no-dog policy. All dogs participating in the Show, apart from guide /hearing/assist dogs, will need to have a permit to be on the grounds .4b. Special regulations may apply to individual sections. See individual Section Regulations.

4c. All entries must be made on forms provided and addressed to the Show Secretary, PO Box 844, Mt. Barker, 5251

4d. A separate entry form must be used for each **Section** entered.

4e. All entry fees must be paid when entries are made.

4f. All exhibits shall be the property of the exhibitor. Livestock to be bona-fide property of exhibitor and produce to have been grown, produced or manufactured by exhibitor.

4g. Every care will be taken of exhibits, but the Society will hold no responsibility for loss, mis-delivery, damage or theft of exhibits.

SET RECIPES

Lemon Sour Cream Cake

250gms butter 2 tsp grated lemon rind 200ml sour cream 2 cups plain flour ¼ cup SR flour 2 cups caster sugar 6 eggs Grease 27cm round cake tin, grease and line base with paper. Cream butter, rind and sugar until light and fluffy; beat in eggs singly; stir ½ sifted flours with ½ the sour cream; add remaining flour and cream; beat until smooth; spread into prepared pan and bake in moderate oven for 1 ½ hours. Stand for 5 minutes before turning onto covered rack/ board to cool. Dust with icing sugar.

Chocolate Salted Caramel Tart

Pastry

125g ice cold butter 250g plain flour 80g caster sugar 1-2tbsp lced water

Liquid Salted Caramel

1 cup caster sugar 1/3 cupwater 100ml cream 50g butter

Chocolate layer

250g dark chocolate 50ml extra virgin olive oil 5g sea salt flakes

Pastry

Blend together butter, flour and sugar until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Add enough water to bring the pastry together as a dough. Wrap in cling film and refrigerate for 30 minutes or until firm. Roll out to ½ cm thick and cut into the shape to fit a 25cm tart tin. Cover and return prepared pastry in tin to the fridge and chill for a further 30 minutes or until completely firm. Blind bake at 200°c for 10 minutes, then remove baking weights and bake for a further 10 minutes or until golden and completely cooked through.

Liquid Salted Caramel

Combine sugar and water and bring to the boil over high heat, caramelize until a really dark amber colour. Deglaze with the cream and butter – be careful as this will splatter. Set aside to cool. Pour the cooled caramel into the pastry base. Place in the fridge for 1-2 hours or until the caramel is firm.

Chocolate layer

Melt together the oil and chocolate then pour over the caramel layer. Return to the fridge until set. Decorate with sea salt flakes.


