

Lemon Sour Cream Cake

250gms butter 2 tsp grated lemon rind 200ml sour cream 2 cups plain flour ¼ cup SR flour 2 cups caster sugar 6 eggs

# Chocolate Salted Caramel Tart

#### Pastry

125g ice cold butter 250g plain flour 80g caster sugar 1-2tbsp lced water

#### **Liquid Salted Caramel**

1 cup caster sugar 1/3 cup water 100ml cream 50g butter Grease 27cm round cake tin, grease and line base with paper. Cream butter, rind and sugar until light and fluffy; beat in eggs singly; stir ½ sifted flours with ½ the sour cream; add remaining flour and cream; beat until smooth; spread into prepared pan and bake in moderate oven for 1 ½ hours. Stand for 5 minutes before turning onto covered rack/ board to cool. Dust with icing sugar.

#### Pastry

Blend together butter, flour and sugar until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Add enough water to bring the pastry together as a dough. Wrap in cling film and refrigerate for 30 minutes or until firm. Roll out to ½ cm thick and cut into the shape to fit a 25cm tart tin. Cover and return prepared pastry in tin to the fridge and chill for a further 30 minutes or until completely firm. Blind bake at 200<sup>o</sup>c for 10 minutes, then remove baking weights and bake for a further 10 minutes or until golden and completely cooked through.

#### **Liquid Salted Caramel**

Combine sugar and water and bring to the boil over high heat, caramelize until a really dark amber colour. Deglaze with the cream and butter – be careful as this will splatter. Set aside to cool. Pour the cooled caramel into the pastry base. Place in the fridge for 1-2 hours or until the caramel is firm.

Chocolate layer 250g dark chocolate 50ml extra virgin olive oil 5g sea salt flakes

#### **Chocolate layer**

Melt together the oil and chocolate then pour over the caramel layer. Return to the fridge until set. Decorate with sea salt flakes.






