# **2018 MOUNT BARKER SHOW SPRING GARDEN COMPETITION**

Well, this year we had cooler than normal judging conditions, ideal spring weather, with the inspection of 15 gardens throughout the Mount Barker District Council, judged on Wednesday 7th November.

There were 4 new entrants this year, with participant numbers 4 down with 2017 total of 19 entrants, with 6 gardens which returned after one or two years off, plus 8 gardens re entering from last year.

Awards in various categories of the competition will be presented on Saturday February 2nd at 9.00pm at the Mt Barker Pre Show Dinner to be held in the St Paul's Lutheran Church Hall, Hahndorf - when all results, including the Grand Champion Garden and Runner-up will be announced.

A dessert competition will be part of the evening's activities, with the entries then served as dessert on the night. There is also a produce competition for the Cut Flowers, Vegetables and Pot Plants.

Proceedings will start at 6.00pm for a 6.30pm dinner, and all entrants are invited to attend, whether for the \$25.00, 3 course meal plus B.Y.O. drinks – or at 9.00pm for the presentation of awards.

# FRONT AND BACK GARDEN
