

History of the Mount Barker Show 142 Years, 1847-2014



The First Mount Barker Show was held in 1847 and was the forerunner to all other shows held in South Australia.

In 1862, the Mount Barker Show was held in Woodside. When a new Society was formed they held the first independent Show on Monday 7th March and it operated under the title of the Mount Barker Agricultural & Horticultural Society. The famous Show Pavilion of 1898 is now the present Show Office site.

In 1987 the Mount Barker Bicentennial Committee formed and organised a once-only event for 1988, reviving the highly successful 'Cream Bowl Festival' of the 1960s. The name 'Cream Bowl' stemmed from the district's prominence in the dairy industry. It was also decided to hold an indoor show in conjunction with the Bicentennial event, as the last Mount Barker Show was held in 1963.

The indoor show proved so popular that a steering committee took the lead to reform the Show Society, leading to the first revived Mount Barker Show being held in 1989. Many people with expertise were needed to convene different sections and a full show as we know it today with horses, cattle, sheep, goats, trade space, sideshows and indoor exhibits - held on Saturday 1st April, 1989.

The Mount Barker Show has continued successfully ever since and this year proudly brings the community together to focus on and help celebrate Mount Barker District's 175th anniversary.

Following recipe to be used for rich fruit cake – cake not to be iced

INGREDIENTS:

250 g butter

250 g dark brown sugar

6 eggs

250 g sultanas

250 g raisins

200 g currants

100 g dates

60 g glace cherries

60 g mixed peel

60 g chopped almonds

375 g plain flour

1 tsp baking powder

1 tsp mixed spice

200 ml sherry or brandy

METHOD:

Mix together all fruits and soak in the sherry or brandy overnight. Sift together flour, baking powder and spice. Cream together butter and sugar. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour and lastly the chopped nuts. Mix thoroughly. Place mixture in prepared square time (approx 19-22 cm in size). Bake in a slow over for approximately 3-3½ hours.

Note: fruit should be cut to the size of currants.

For Genoa cake, exhibitor's own recipe should be used – cake not to be iced Size and shape at exhibitor's discretion – no recipe need accompany exhibit

BY-LAWS, RULES & REGULATIONS

MEMBERSHIP

- 1a. Membership is compulsory for all livestock and horse exhibitors, but is exempt for all other exhibitors and poultry exhibitors at the Mt Barker Show.
- 1b. All members over 18 years of age are entitled to vote at the Annual General, Special General & General Committee meetings

ADMISSION

- 2a. Any person wishing to leave the grounds with the intention of returning must obtain a passout at the gates.
- 2b. The Show grounds will open at 6 am on the day of the show.
- 2c. All pavilion exhibits must be staged for judging by 9 am Saturday and must not be removed before 4 pm.
- 2d. Handicrafts, Jams, Preserves & Art exhibits must be delivered by 11:45 am on Friday prior to the show as judging will commence at 12 noon. Flower exhibits can also be received on Friday evening, between 6 pm and 8 pm only.
- 2e. With the exception of convenors and stewards, the show halls will be cleared of all persons at 3:30 pm Saturday and be opened at 4 pm only to exhibitors presenting their exhibitor's pass to the door-keepers for the purpose of collecting their exhibits.
- 2f. Livestock exhibits will be received at the show grounds up to 8:30 am on Saturday and must not be removed before 4 pm; dairy cattle may be removed immediately after the Grand Parade at 3:30 pm.
- 2g. No truck or trailer used for transporting of livestock may be parked inside the showgrounds without the approval of the show committee. Any vehicle permitted to park on the grounds must do so according to the Society's instructions.

TRADE SPACE EXHIBITS

- 3a. The Society will allocate suitable sites on the showgrounds for trade space exhibitors. All applications for these sites, accompanied by fees, must be in the hands of the secretary by the advertised closing date.
- b. All trade space exhibits must be in position by 9 am Saturday and may not be removed before 4 pm Saturday. All cars must be removed by 9.30 am and may not re-enter the grounds until 4pm.
- c. All working exhibits likely present a danger to the public shall be adequately protected.
- d. The Society will take no responsibility whatsoever for any accidents or injuries to any persons caused by trade space exhibits or exhibitors.
- e. The Society will not provide any cover or housing for trade space exhibitors, any such requirements being the responsibility of the stall holder.
- f. All sites will be allocated to meet as best as possible the requirements of the accepted exhibitor. However final determination shall be at the discretion of the society. No tents, booths or hawkers will be allowed on the grounds without the consent of the Society and payment of an entrance fee.

SECTION REGULATIONS

4a. The Mt Barker District Show has a no-dog policy. The only dogs allowed on the Show-grounds during Show day are those animals participating in Show activities or entertainments. All dogs participating in these activities will need to be registered with the Society and will be issued a permit to be on the grounds.

- 4b. All guide dogs/hearing dogs will be accepted through the gates.
- 4c. Special regulations may apply to individual sections. Supplementary exhibitor by-laws, rules and regulations are included in the section descriptions in this programme.

ENTRIES & EXHIBITS

- 5a. In all cases, entries must be made on forms provided by the Society and addressed to the Show Secretary. Entries must be received no later than the time specified. Early entries are appreciated.
- 5b. No phone entries and no late entries accepted. Any late entries will be returned to the exhibitor.
- 5c. Entries for different sections must be written on separate entry forms.
- 5d. All entry fees must be paid when entries are made.
- 5e. All exhibits shall be the property of the exhibitor. Livestock to be bona-fide property of exhibitor.
- 5f. All produce entered for competition must be the production of the present season and have been grown, produced or manufactured by exhibitor.
- 5g. Every care will be taken of exhibits, but the Society will under no circumstances hold itself responsible for loss, miss-delivery, damage or theft of exhibits.
- 5h. The Committee and convenors reserve the right to make any alterations to the schedules as they deem necessary.
- 5i. Entries may be submitted by email to the Show Secretary, using forms available on the Show's website. Payment of entry fees may be made by direct bank transfer.

See Rules and Advice for Exhibitors for more details.

DISPUTES & PENALTIES

- 6a. Any protests must be made to the Secretary in writing within half an hour of the opening of the show hall to the public, or within half an hour of completion of judging, whichever is the later.
- 6b. Each protest to be accompanied by a fee of \$5, which will be forfeited to the Society should the protest be deemed frivolous.
- 6c. The President will be the final arbitrator in the event of any dispute.
- 6d. No exhibitor or his/her agent will have any personal communication with the judges while they are performing their duties. On its being proved that such communication has taken place, the exhibitor will be disqualified.
- 6e. Convenors and stewards are to be impartial at all times.
- 6f. The Society reserves the right to refuse entry, or not allow any exhibitor to compete, without having to assign a reason.
- 6g. Any exhibit, which in the opinion of the Executive Committee has been fraudulently or wrongly entered, may be disqualified and the exhibitor disqualified from taking any prizes associated with the entry.
- 6h. Any owner or exhibitor refusing to obey any reasonable order of the steward in charge may have their exhibits withdrawn from consideration by the judge and be disqualified from further competition at the show.

PRIZES & PRIZE MONEY

- 7a. No exhibitor's name to appear on any exhibit until after the prizes have been awarded.
- 7b. No prize will be awarded unless an exhibit is deemed worthy of the judges, who may award 2^m or 3^m prizes in lieu of 1^m and 2^m ; in all cases the judge's decision is final.
- 7c The judges may withhold prizes in any classes without giving any reasons.

- 7d. Any exhibitors not receiving their prize money within 4 weeks of the show should communicate with the Secretary or Treasurer; unclaimed money will be forfeited to the Society. 7e. The Committee may withhold any prizes won by an exhibitor who does not comply with the conditions.
- 7f. Prize monies should be collected from convenors on Show Day.
- 7g. All livestock convenors to pay exhibitors when they leave the judging ring. All convenors will hand out prize money after 4 pm Saturday.

LIVESTOCK AND DISEASES

- 8a. Any exhibits from properties within the proclaimed Branched Broom Rape quarantine zone or from out-of-zone properties infested with this weed must be accompanied by a statutory declaration and appropriate certificate of approval.
- 8b. All dairy/beef cattle, sheep and dairy goats must be TB and Brucellosis free and confirm their Johne's programme disease status. A copy of their Johne's certificate must be presented to the Show Secretary when entering, otherwise entries will be returned.
- 8c. All other livestock must be in good health and free from parasites.
- 8d. PIC numbers must be enclosed with entries and all animals must have NLIS identification tags fitted. (Each animal and each property.)
- 8e. If the advertised temperature for Show day in Mt Barker is 35°C or higher, the animal sections will be cancelled.

FEDERAL COUNCIL OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES

LIST OF BANNED ITEMS AT AGRICULTURAL SHOWS:

Drug Related Goods (including Cocaine Kits, Bongs etc), Explicit and Hard-core T-Shirts, Fireworks - Crackers, Fuel Type Fire Lighters (Zippo), Horns and Trumpets, Knives (including Pen Knives), Laser Pointers, Metal and wooden Martial Art, Nunchakas, Playing Cards (Nude or Lurid), Pressure Pack Snow, Pressure Pack Fart Gas, Silly String, Stink Bombs, Water Bombs, Ball Bearing Guns, Eight Shot Caps, Pellet Guns, Pop Downs (Throw Downs), Potato Guns (Bullet Type), Roll Caps, Strip Caps, Water Pistols over 150mm Samurai Swords, English Swords and Fencing Swords are to be sold in Sealed Packages by Licensed Traders ONLY.

HOW TO ENTER – RULES AND ADVICE FOR EXHIBITORS

LEMON SOUR CREAM CAKE

250G Butter 2 cups Castor sugar

2 teaspoons grated lemon rind 6 eggs

2 Cups Plain flour ¼ cup SR flour

200g carton Sour cream

Grease 27cm round cake tin, line base with paper & grease, Cream butter, rind & sugar until light & fluffy, beat in eggs singly, stir ½ sifted flours with ½ the sour cream; add remaining flour & cream; beat until smooth, spread into prepared pan & bake in mod oven for 1½ hours, stand for 5mins before turning onto covered rack/ board to cool, dust with icing sugar to serve.

CORN MUFFINS

1 Cup SR flour 1 cup cornmeal (polenta)

½ teaspoon baking powder 1 egg

2/3 cup buttermilk 2 tablespoons oil

4 spring onions finely diced ½ red capsicum finely diced 1 teaspoon garlic 1 cup drained corn kernels

Sift together dry ingredients, whisk together egg & buttermilk, use ½ the oil and sauté onions, capsicums & garlic in a small pan; stir in remaining oil & corn, fold gently; do not beat. Spoon into muffin tins, bake @ 200 deg. until cooked.

GINGERBREAD MEN

75gms butter % cup golden syrup % cup castor sugar 1½ cups plain flour % teaspoon bicarb soda ½ teaspoon ginger

½ teaspoon cinnamon 1 egg

½ teaspoon ground cloves

Melt butter, add castor sugar, golden syrup & dissolve over low heat, sift flour, bicarb soda, ginger, cinnamon & cloves; add egg & combine, add this to butter, sugar & syrup mix, knead well; roll out to approx.. 5mm & cut into shapes, bake in moderate oven 5-7 mins, decorate when cool.

PIZZA WHEELS

3 Sheets pastry

FILLING: 1 small onion finely diced 3 rashers bacon chopped finely

½ red capsicum finely diced 2 tablespoons tomato paste/ pesto

½ teaspoon dried oregano 100gms grated cheese

Spread paste over pastry; sprinkle with oregano; spread over remaining ingredients, roll up like a Swiss roll; cut into 11/2cm slices, place on greased tray & bake 20mins at 200*

QUINOA COOKIES

2 ½ cups quinoa flakes ½ cup ground flax seed

2 eggs 1 tspn cinnamon

1/4 cup olive oil or melted butter 1/2 cup honey

1 cup dark chocolate chips 2 mashed bananas

1 tspn vanilla

Preheat oven to 180 C. Mix all ingredients except chocolate chip cookies with fork until flakes have been blended in. Add choc chips and mix again. Drop in tablespoons on well-greased tray. Bake 15 - 18 minutes until slightly golden brown on top. Makes approximately 30 cookies.
